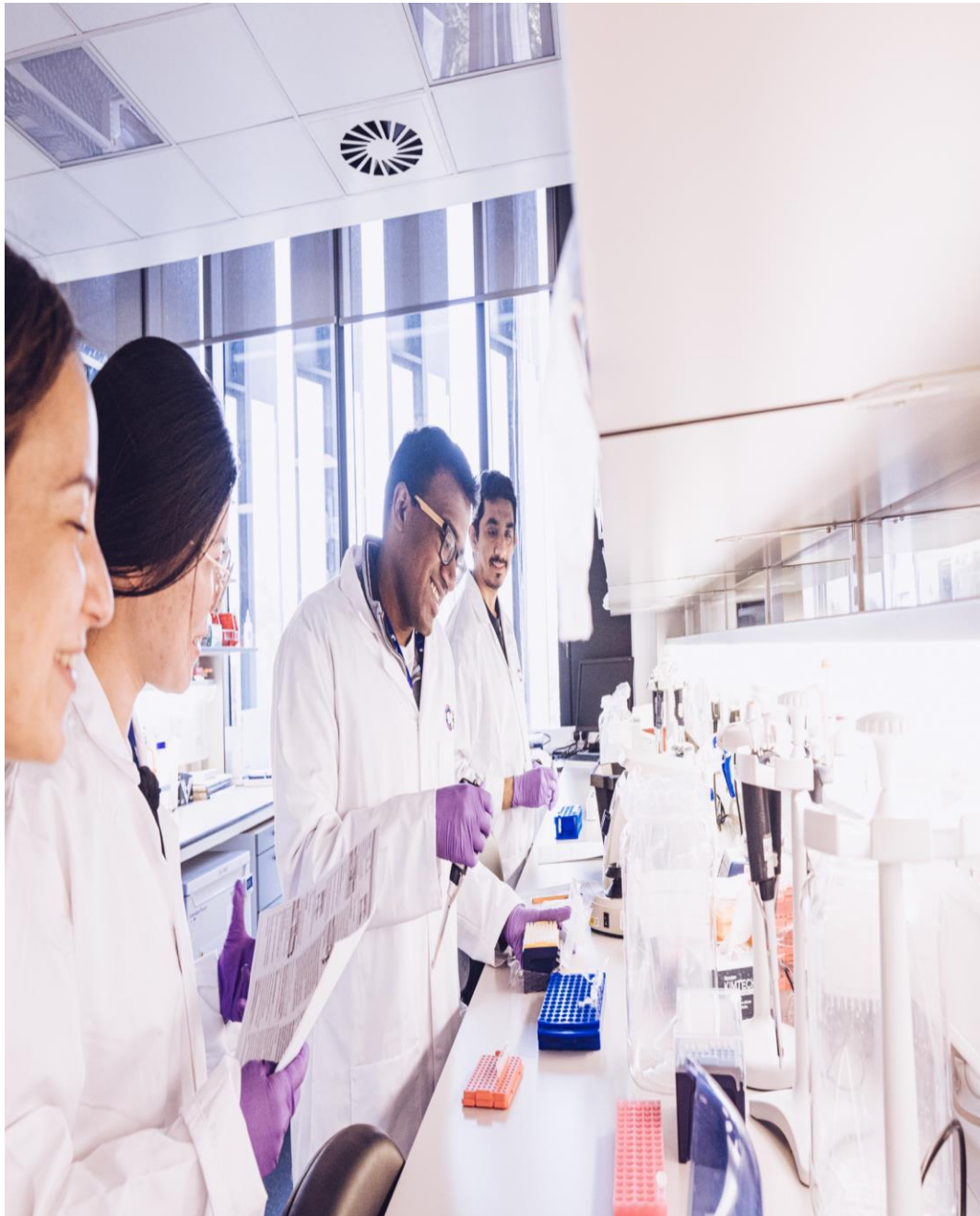

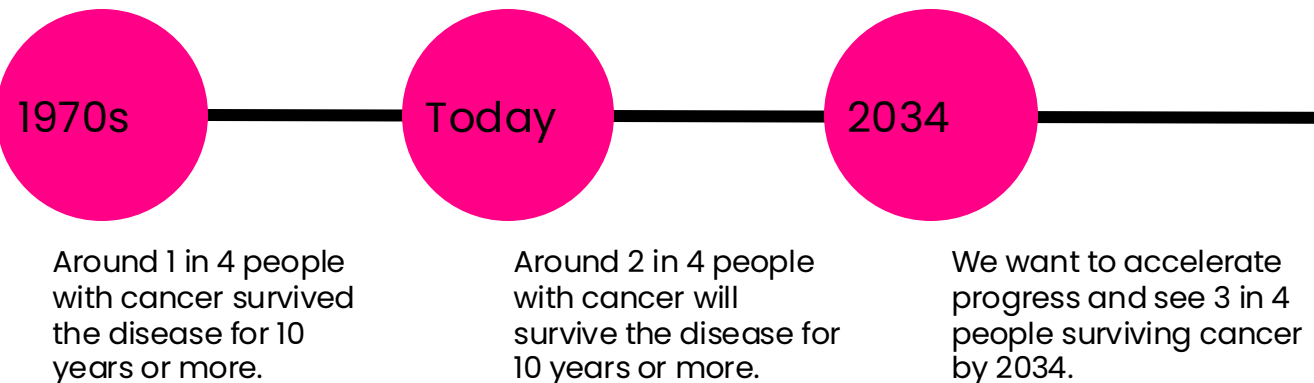

World record attempt: The most people skipping in multiple venues at the same time

Current holder: 70,880 participants from 294 schools in an event organised by California Association for Health, Physical Education, Recreation & Dance (CAHPERD) and Jamba Juice in California, USA, on 1 February 2010.

Venue size - How many skips can your venue have?

Each skipper needs approximately 9m^2

Take the m^2 available to skip in and divide by 9m^2 , to give total capacity for skippers in your venue.
(i.e. $1000\text{m}^2 / 9\text{m}^2 = 111$ skippers at that venue)

You must have the minimum number of 25 skippers at your venue to be included in the GWR total

Your World Record Checklist

To complete the Guinness World Record, you must use these Guidelines for on the day activity:

1. Loud signal

A loud start and finish signal recognised by all participants must be used in each venue.

2. Commercial Ropes

The ropes used must be commercially available and designed for individual skipping.

3. One rope per person

Only one rope per participant is allowed. Likewise, only one participant per rope is allowed.

4. Good skipping standards

Participants must be able to skip at an acceptable standard. This is at the discretion of the stewards and the final discretion of the independent witnesses and Guinness World Records.

5. No stopping for more than 10 seconds

If a participant misses the rope or stops for more than 10 seconds, they must be disqualified.

6. Three-minute skip

At a given signal made at the exact same time across all venues, all participants must begin skipping and should continue to do so for three minutes.

Additional information

Stewards

- For every 50 participants there must be 1 designated steward
- Stewards must not come from the organisation holding the record attempt

Pre-approval

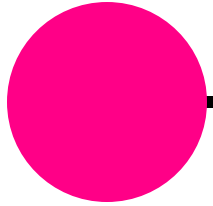
- Counting method

Photographic evidence of your attempt taking place capturing the details provided by the independent witnesses. The photographic evidence must include an aerial photo of the crowd or a photo showing the entire group.

Video evidence of the entire record attempt for each venue, from start to finish that enables us to confirm the measurement achieved, that the guidelines have been adhered to and verify the details provided by the independent witnesses. In addition, all entrances and exits must be monitored on video and the counting process must be clearly visible in the video too.

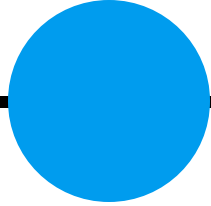

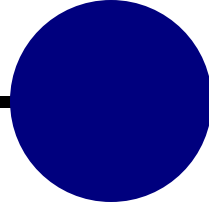
Step 1

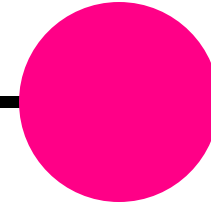
Step 2
